

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH NEWS

Police are urging residents to review the security of their sheds, garages and outbuildings following a number of burglaries in the County.

Two barns located in Rectory Road, Bacton were broken into over the weekend of Saturday 29th February and Sunday 1st March. A ride on lawn mower was stolen from one barn and

gardening equipment was stolen from the other.

In light of this, we are reminded of the following tips:

- · Always keep your shed or garage locked.
- Fit an alarm if you can.
- Use coach bolts to fasten hinges and hasp and staples or padbar.
- Security mark property and register it at www.immobilise.com
- Fit anchor points to secure items to.
- Avoid storing high value items in the shed.
- · Avoid windows in the shed if possible.
- Use two good quality closed shackle padlocks to secure the shed door.
- Always lock integral doors between the garage and house.
- Add ground mounted locking bars to enhance security on 'up and over' garage doors.
- Use two good quality closed shackle padlocks or a 5 lever mortice and rim lock (BS3621) to secure outward or inward opening doors.

Beware Coronavirus Scams

Since February 2020, the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has identified 21 reports of fraud where Coronavirus was mentioned, with victim losses totalling over £800k.

Of the 21 reports, ten were made by victims that attempted to purchase protective face masks from fraudulent sellers. One victim reported losing over £15k when they purchased face masks that were never delivered.

There have also multiple reports about coronavirus-themed phishing emails attempting to trick people into opening malicious attachments or revealing sensitive personal and financial information.

To reduce the amount of junk mail you receive, register for free with the Mail Preference Service.

The Mailing Preference Service (MPS) is a free service to enable consumers to have their names and home addresses in the UK removed from lists used by the industry.

Register on the MPS website (www.mpsonline.org.uk) or by calling 0207 291 3310.

To help stop marketing phone calls register for free with the Telephone Preference Service.

The Telephone Preference Service (TPS) is a free service. It is a legal requirement that all organisations (including charities, voluntary organisations and political parties) do not make calls to numbers registered on the TPS unless they have your consent to do so.

Some scams pose as the TPS and may contact you requesting you to renew your TPS registration at a cost. Remember the TPS is a free service and any call trying to charge you for it is a scam.

HELP FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council are in the process of building confidential registers of vulnerable people in the village and of volunteers who will make themselves available to assist where required. Obviously information from these registers will need to be shared appropriately but with due regard to General Data Protection Regulations.

Priority will be given to those older people who are living alone (or elderly couples) without nearby family support. The aim is simply to ensure that no-one in the village is left alone without support as evolving government advice (or orders) are put into practice.

Please contact the Parish Clerk (preferably by email clerk@walshampc.myzen.co.uk) to advise any of the following:

- · If you need support
- If you know someone who needs support
- · If you are willing to volunteer to support someone
- · If you are already supporting someone
- If you and / or family are already in self-isolation due to illness

This information will greatly assist the Parish Council with co-ordination of responses and is especially important if someone is living alone even if the only requirement is to keep a close eye.

It is everyone's responsibility to do what they can to stop Covid 19 from spreading if particularly vulnerable members of the community are to be protected. Particularly vulnerable people are those who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- are 70 or over
- · have a long-term condition
- · are pregnant
- have a weakened immune system

If you do not have an email account, or need help, do ask someone to make contact on your behalf.

Prescriptions can be collected for you

You just need to advise the pharmacy who will be collecting for you. If you have not been able to arrange this and cannot collect medication yourself then contact the Parish Clerk who will try to arrange this for you.

Groceries can be delivered

If you are self isolating or otherwise avoiding contact let us know. Volunteers can assist with delivering your groceries to you.

Rolfes is also offering a free grocery delivery service.

You will all no doubt be aware by now that Acts of Worship within our churches have regrettably had to be postponed for the foreseeable future. I understand that Services are to be streamed from both the Cathedral at Bury St Edmunds and by our Bishops. For further information on these please do get in touch with me.

Our churches across the Benefice will remain open for those who may wish for a time of private prayer or indeed just quiet time to themselves, all are welcome. I shall as an individual Priest still be saying the Daily Office of both Morning and Evening Prayer, and lighting candles, in one of our churches, on a daily basis.

Although Baptisms have been put on hold, Weddings can still go ahead but with the restriction of only five people; Priest, Wedding couple and two witnesses. Cremations will be held at the chosen Crematorium, where I understand guidelines are to be issued with regard to numbers attending, Burial services will still take place, albeit around the Graveside.





of colourful butterflies and moths together with some exotic looking caterpillars to brighten our March meeting. In Peter's fact filled talk we learned that of the UK's 59 butterflies 35 are to be found in Suffolk, if you know where to look and where they like to feed and breed or even hibernate. Telling a large white from a Brimstone or Green veined white or a lady Orange tip will probably still be beyond us but we do now know not to assume everything white is heading for the cabbages. There was plenty of advice for gardeners hoping to tempt more species to visit. Despite the fact that there are2,5000 species of moth in the UK over 60 have become extinct in the last 150 years and Interestingly there are more moths flying about in daytime than butterflies. Some moth's rival butterflies for beauty and most feed on plants and it is only 1% who relish natural fibres! The dedication of the Trust volunteers in recording huge and detailed data was impressive. However there are still some 'black holes' where new recorders could make a difference and perhaps help preserve and protect these wonders of nature for generations to come. We shall all look more closely in future at these creatures and their ability to work the magic of metamorphosis.



Lorna and I have been running the Local Artists Exhibition and Sale in the Church over the annual Walsham Gardens Weekend since 2013. It has been both fun and rewarding; we have raised just over £2,500 for Gardens Weekend in those seven years (we take 25% of the sale price of each piece we sell i.e. we have taken just over £10,000 in sales).

It is now time to hand on to someone new who could bring fresh energy to the exhibition. We will be doing it for the last time this year so it would be ideal if our successors could join us this year to see how it is done before 'going solo', next year.

Apart from the initial contact to the artists at the beginning of July, 90% of the work is in the week before and the week after the event, both of which are quite busy. 



A TITANIC PUZZLE

Quite a few Walsham residents have titanium implants, and damaged bones are strengthened by the wonder metal. It was first discovered by a Cornish vicar, an amateur geologist, back in 1791. After years of experiment the metal was eventually processed. Seeking for a name, scientists decided on 'titanium'. The Titans of ancient Greek myth were giants who ruled the world. The name seemed suitable for this metal, part of the earth's crust, with marvellous properties. It is stronger than steel, yet less than half its weight; it resists corrosion, so that rust is avoided. Titanium is admirably suited to the job it performs: that of reinforcing the skeleton.

In 1912 a huge passenger liner was launched at Belfast, and a gigantic-sounding name was chosen for it. Unfortunately RMS Titanic was not unsinkable. The pronunciation is interesting. The metal *titanium* is usually pronounced with a short 'i' in the opening syllable, as in *Titania*, Shakespeare's shape-changing fairy queen who was also named after the Titans.

- meeting where he felt that the focus of the deliberations appeared to be on redefining previously agreed priorities and focusing on environmental and green issues rather than putting forward sites for development. The next meeting is due to take place on 12th March but it was noted that some key people would probably be absent.
- 4.2 Streetlighting conversion The Clerk referred to costing from SCC which for phase II were half the costs for phase I, noting this would be due to there being less work required on individual lamps in phase II. Clerk asked Cllrs if they still anted to obtain more quotes based on the detailed specification from SCC. Action Clerk to obtain at least one more quote. Clerk is clarifying if we can now expect a new contractor to have competed phase I upgrades soon.
- 4.3 **Community Council** Cllr Bartholomew gave a detailed update on the situation and the steps that were now being taken with the full knowledge of the Charity Commission.
- Parking Finningham Road blind bend Cllrs Arbon and Bartholomew gave updates on the position about concerns raised by residents about the wording of the minutes from last meeting and ongoing interAction with Flagship Housing. To be clear, the Parish Council has concerns about the parking/traffic issues on the bend just outside Oak Cottages on the Finningham Road and is of the view that parking restrictions should probably be applied for at some point. But before any decision is made on that, the Parish Council has been engaging with Flagship Housing in order to ascertain what options there may be to mitigate any loss of on road parking space parking restrictions would entail. The Parish Council is also liaising with SCC Highways on the same point. To reassure residents, before anything was Actioned Consultation exercises would have to be carried out by Flagship and SCC. The Clerk notes that minutes of Parish Council meetings are not verbatim records of discussions in those meetings. Attendance at the meetings where these issues are discussed may help to reassure parishioners that Parish Councillors are only trying to address an identified safety issue but at the same time properly considering options that might be available to reduce impacts elsewhere. Action Cllrs Arbon and Bartholomew to follow up
- 4.5 Four Ashes Triangle Cllr Belson advised that this was in hand and could be removed from matters arising.
- 4.6 Churchyard Tree Work Clerk advised that this will take place on April 16th and that the vicar had advised he was happy with the work taking place on that date.
- 4.7 **GWE stream and bulb planting** Cllr Belson advised that this was in hand and could be removed from matters arising.
- 4.8 **Street Cleaning** Clerk reported no progress due to other priorities. ACTION Clerk to draw up contract for next meeting.

GENERAL PRACTICES & PHARMACIES ARE OPEN.

At the present time, GP's and their teams are **not** being used to diagnose or assess Covid -19 cases. They are ensuring the continuation of general health care, and assessing urgent cases not related to Covid-19.

On-line booking of appointments is suspended, as all cases are screened on the telephone to avoid Covid-19 cases attending general practices.

In line with self-distancing, a lot of routine medical care is temporarily being given as telephone advice, rather than face to face consulting.

If you think you may have Covid-19, assess your symptoms on the NHS111 website. Only call NHS111 if you do not have internet access, or if you cannot self-care at home because of your symptoms. Do not go to A&E or a GP practice, but follow instructions from NHS111. In the case of an emergency 999 call, tell the service if you may have Covid-19.

Please do not order your repeat medicines before they are due. There are no shortages of drugs because of Covid-19. Practices and pharmacies are working with communities to cope with an increased demand for home delivery of prescriptions. Walsham is covered by several surgeries, so check on the village website or the Parish Council contact number, whether your pharmacy has a group delivery service to Walsham arranged. Try to avoid telephoning the pharmacy unless necessary.

If any third party collects your prescription for you, they will need to be able to confirm your name, date of birth and address. For some medicines, such as strong painkillers, the person collecting will need to show identification.

BEWARE! SCAMMERS KNOCKING ON YOUR DOOR OR CALLING


There have been reports of callers on elderly and vulnerable people in Suffolk from people claiming to be from the Red Cross, offering to do shopping but taking cash and never returning.
