## Walsham-le-Willows Parish Council, May 2024

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Consultation on Devolution Proposals Closing Soon - The 10-week public consultation on our proposed devolution deal with the Government closes on 26<sup>th</sup> May, refer to <a href="https://www.suffolk.gov.uk/devolution">www.suffolk.gov.uk/devolution</a> and social media. The matter will be debated later this summer at full council. Devolution would include:

- o A directly elected leader of Suffolk County Council
- o Control of a new investment fund worth £480m over the next thirty years
- o Local control of the Adult Education Budget each year (worth £9.4m in 2025/26)
- o £5.8m one-off funding to prepare brownfield sites for development
- o Multi-year transport funding plus £500,000 over two years.

**Electricity Supply Operator Offshore Coordination Study** – This study is relevant to National Grid's proposals for Norwich to Tilbury. The <u>ESO East Anglia Network Study</u> was published on 12 March 2024 by The National Grid Electricity System Operator, this was set up to explore options for transmitting power in Norfolk, Suffolk, and Essex including onshore, offshore and hybrid schemes, and undergrounding. National Grid has committed to take the results of this study into account in designing the electricity distribution system for this region.

A summary of ESO's findings follows:

Following the preliminary screening assessment, network configuration options have undergone holistic assessment using the above methodology. These are set out below:

- 1. Predominately offshore option variation without EACN (connection point in N. Essex)
- 2. Predominately offshore option variation with EACN
- 3. Onshore option
- 4. Alternative onshore option variation without Bramford to EACN
- 5. Alternative onshore option variation without EACN b. Alternative onshore option variation without EACN sensitivity
- 6. Hybrid onshore and offshore option variation with EACN
- 7. Hybrid onshore and offshore option variation without EACN
- 8. Onshore High Voltage (HVDC) option
- 9. Predominantly offshore option Utilising Bradwell as a landing point.

**Waveney Valley Landscape** Assessment - The "<u>Valued Landscape Assessment</u>" was jointly commissioned by Norfolk and Suffolk County Councils. The study provides evidence of the site's importance, sensitivity and vulnerability to various new energy proposals. It was undertaken by leading landscape consultancy, Alison Farmer Associates, look at the landscape of the Waveney Valley, outside The Broads National Park

**Road Surfacing** – The surface dressing programme begins this week, 102 roads will be surface dressed and a further 319 will receive full machine resurfacing during the coming year.
